The King's Academy is an independent, nonprofit coeducational college preparatory school, grades Pre-K through twelfth. Founded in 1998, TKA has an enrollment of approximately 175 students. Enrollment draws from 15 school districts, covering 2 counties, as well as 8 foreign countries. New students are admitted to all grades. There are currently 22 members of the teaching faculty of whom 100% hold bachelor's degrees and 41% hold a master's degree or higher.
